## The Agri-Food Act, 2004 [section 12]

## THE MILK MARKETING PLAN REGULATIONS - PROCESSOR LICENCE

**Order No. 35/18.** The SASKATCHEWAN MILK MARKETING BOARD, pursuant to the provisions of *The Milk Marketing Plan Regulations* and *The Agri-Food Act, 2004*, hereby determines and orders as follows:

- 1 Every person applying for a processor licence shall:
  - (a) make application in writing to the Board;
- (b) provide the Board with any information that the Board may reasonably require in order to determine whether or not to approve the application and issue the licence; and
  - (c) pay a fee of \$25.
- 2 If the Board receives an application pursuant to section 1 and is satisfied that the applicant has complied with the Act, Regulations, and Orders of the Board and that it is in the public interest to do so, the Board may issue a processor licence to the applicant.
- 3 The holder of a processor licence shall only operate the milk processing plants noted in the processor licence.
- 4 Each processor licence shall expire on December 31st of the year in which it was issued.
- 5 Order 12/10 is hereby wholly revoked.
- 6 This Order will remain in effect for a period not longer than ten years from the date this Order is approved by the Agri-Food Council.

Order No. 35/18 is made pursuant to section 5, 7(1)(ee), 7(1)(ff), 20, 20.1, 20.2, 20.4 and 20.5 of *The Milk Marketing Plan Regulations* and shall be effective upon the date of this Order. By order of the Saskatchewan Milk Marketing Board.
