CONTRACT WORK – PILOT PROJECT – INDIGENOUS AMBASSADOR

SaskMilk is a producer-elected marketing board representing Saskatchewan's dairy farmers. We are responsible for several activities and are actively engaged in advocating for and promoting dairy, dairy farming, and supply management.

We are looking for a member of Saskatchewan's Indigenous community to be a liaison between SaskMilk and Indigenous community schools, help us facilitate nutrition workshops, and advocate for our School Milk programs. SaskMilk is committed to quality programs and prioritizes respect and understanding of different backgrounds.

Role & Duties:

- Help develop and administer nutrition and school milk programs in 10 Indigenous schools across Saskatchewan.
- Provide nutritional guidance, label interpretation, and consultation services to students, teachers, community groups, etc.
- Plan, evaluate and conduct nutrition education programs and assist in development of educational materials targeted to Indigenous communities.
- Analyze current scientific nutritional studies and evaluate program effectiveness to improve communication and awareness of nutrition in dairy.
- Confer with other health professionals, community groups, community leaders, and government to provide consultation and advice in areas of nutrition interpretation, intervention, and policy.
- Liaison between schools, grocery stores, government programs, and community members.

Requirements and Skills:

- Successful completion of an accredited dietetic internship (Essential)
- Member of the Dietitians of Canada (Preferred)
- Proven work experience in similar role or capacity
- Excellent oral and written communication skills
- Ability to work independently and collaboratively
- Strong time-management and organizational skills

This contract will pay \$20,000 per school year plus pre-established travel expenses.

Expected time commitment and scheduling will be discussed and agreed upon between SaskMilk and the applicant.
